Aims and Ambition:

Aim 1: Prevention:

Commission Services from the VCS that reduce demand on acute services

Aim 2: Independence:

Encourage Residents to live independently for as long as possible

Early Intervention Model

Aim 3: Low Level Support:

Supporting residents through low level support through early intervention.

Aim 4: Specialist Support: for residents with long-term conditions and carers.

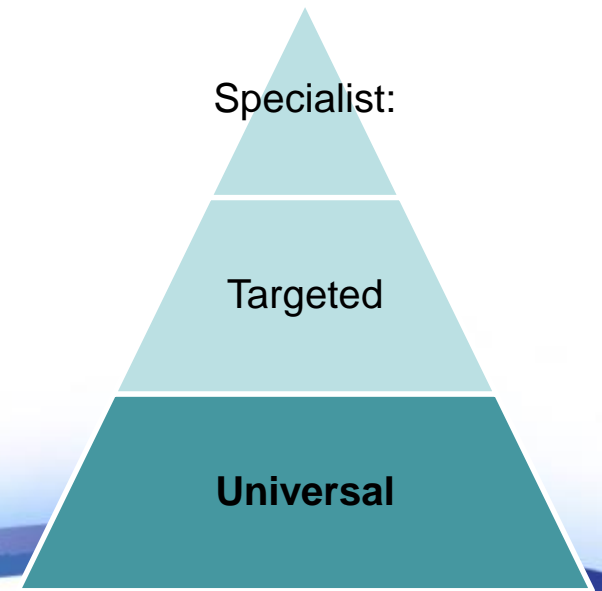

Tier 1: Universal Services:
Community Wellbeing



Tier One – Community Wellbeing

- **Description:** These services are aimed at those with no specific social care needs / symptoms of illness.
- **Example Services:** These interventions are likely to include addressing loneliness and isolation. This will also include active communities, healthy lifestyles, and low level practical services.
- **Example Service areas:**
 - Befriending
 - Social activities
 - Volunteering
 - Third Sector Development
 - Community capacity Building
- **Budget:**
£604,000 approx



Tier Two – Early Intervention and Prevention

Description: These services will be aimed at identifying people at risk, providing early intervention and support prior to deterioration.

Example Services: These interventions are likely to include identifying specific health conditions, or those who have existing (low levels) of social care needs. This will include long-term-conditions.

Example Services areas:

- Mental Health services
- Falls prevention activities
- Sensory services
- Services for people with learning difficulties
- Support for people with Dementia

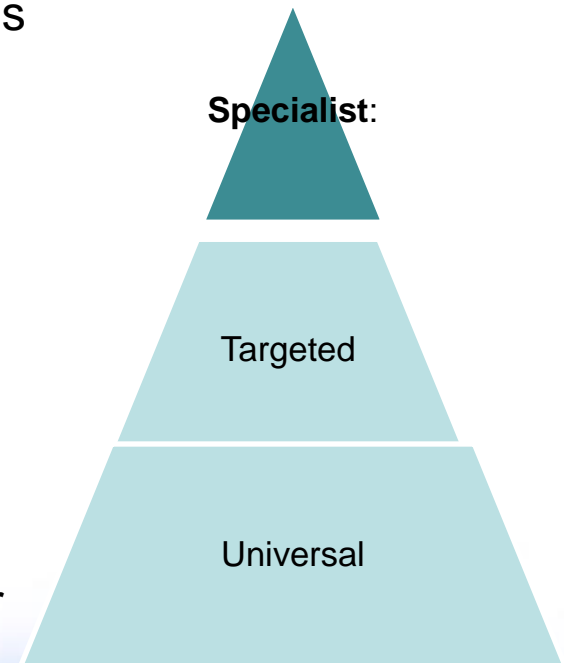
Budget:

£425,000 approx



Tier Three – Reablement

- **Description:** These services are aimed at minimising disability or deterioration from those with established health conditions, or complex social care needs. This will be with the aims of focusing on maximising people’s functioning and independence.
- **Example Services:** These interventions are likely to include an element of rehabilitation and reablement.
- **Example Services:**
 - Services that support hospital discharge
 - Services for people who have had a Cardio Vascular Accident(CVA) i.e. Stroke
- **Budget**
£125,000 approx



New integrated approach

- Single lead partner for each of the tiers
- A single point of access / contact for each tier
- Integrated referral systems between providers & tiers



In addition

We are currently consulting on two other areas which are closely aligned to Early intervention & prevention services. These are

Services for Carers – We are looking to recommission services and through consultation identify the key priorities. Two events are being planned for this

Healthwatch – The Council will be recommissioning the Healthwatch service and are keen to have the views from organisations and residents about what the service should look like
